

Lunch Containers State Contest 2001 Intermediate Situation

Kari is entering 7th grade this fall and is looking for a lunch container that she can use to bring her noon lunch to school in.

The container must be insulated. She wants one that will keep her lunch cold and safe until her lunch hour. She will be purchasing her beverage in the school cafeteria during her noon hour.

Kari also wants a container that will be easy to carry in her backpack. Kari is also looking for a space for to protect food that may be crushed easily.

Criteria:

- 1. Keeps lunch cold and safe until her noon hour**
- 2. Easy to carry in her backpack**
- 3. Crushproof space**

Lunch Containers State Contest 2001 Intermediate Official Reasons

Upon analysis of the lunch containers for 7th grade Kari I place this class 1-3-4-2. All of the containers were insulated and would keep Kari's lunch cold and safe until her noon hour.

In my top pair 1 is placed over 3 because 1 provided Kari with more space and had a small crush proof container in it, which was one of Kari's criteria in selecting a lunch container. I do grant that 3 is smaller and more compact which would make it easier to carry in her backpack.

In my middle pair I placed 3 over 4 because 3 would be easier for Kari to carry in her backpack. 4 was too large in overall size and had the extra water bottle, which Kari did not need. I do grant that 4 does have a refreezable ice pack included.

In my bottom pair 4 places over 2 because 4 would be easier for Kari to place in her backpack. 2 is left at the bottom of this class because it is too large for Kari to put in her backpack and does not have a lot of space and for this reason food might be easily crushed.

For these reasons I placed the class 1-3-4-2.
