Rules	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Picture of the species with the project must be part of the display. • The exhibitor's name, county, age and project name must be included on the back of the exhibit.
Guidelines	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The size of the three dimensional displays and posters should be consistent with the size recommended by Minnesota 4-H. • Creativity is encouraged in developing the exhibit. It may include but is not limited to three-dimensional displays, models, reports, diagrams, pictures, or photographs. • Resources should be credited and documented in the exhibit (e.g., books, internet, 4-H or Extension publications, person with special knowledge, magazine articles, etc.).
